School Policies

The Silvermine School of Art continues its legacy of art education by offering programs for students of all ages, in all levels of proficiency from beginner to advanced.

General Studio Policies

All studio scheduling is at the discretion of Silvermine Art Center Administrative Staff. Students attending programs at Silvermine Art Center are permitted to utilize the facilities during scheduled program times *only* and <u>must</u> adhere to the general policies set forth below.

Arrival/Set Up:

If the studio set up is complete, students may enter the classroom 15 minutes before their class time to prepare. If the set-up is not complete, students <u>must</u> wait outside of the classroom until permitted to enter.

Departure/Clean Up:

Our studios are **multi-use spaces** operating 7 days a week. Students are expected to clean their individual spaces and be prepared to exit the class on time. In the event that additional time is needed students must be prepared to leave the classroom <u>no more than 10 minutes after the scheduled end time of the program</u>.

- It is imperative that neither paint nor solvents are poured directly into the sinks. If you are unsure of the right way to clean your palate or brushes, please be sure to speak with your instructor
- Please be mindful of our energy usage and be sure to close all doors & windows upon your exit

For the safety of students aged 16 or younger, parents are required to drop off and pick up students at the studio location. Youth students may not be dropped off in the parking lot.

Open Sketch

These sessions are open to the public, ages 16 & up and provide the opportunity to work in a studio environment from a live model, in the artist's preferred medium. We have a maximum capacity of 12 students per session.

Models are of male and female genders and are nude for all bookings <u>except</u> the first Friday of every month.

Open Sketch sessions are all walk-in. Payment is made in <u>CASH or CHECK</u> (exact change only). There is no payment through credit card.




